# Why use the CAA application for community planning?

- Provides a general business model
- Develops a well-rounded community that meets the needs of its membership
- Helps define basic tasks as a general "To Do" list for the year (The more tasks accomplished, the more value you provide to your membership)
- Gives your community a sound basis for program planning
- Offering CAA-related activities provides individual members with valuable professional development opportunities
- Serves as a solid template for incoming leadership
- Provides a framework for STC to provide measurable and comparable feedback to communities



#### What's New in the 2017 CAA?

- Guidelines and application contain more detailed descriptions, additional "show me" examples, and notes on what is not acceptable
- Some point values have changed to reflect a more fair point distribution
  - "Member Engagement: Informal Small Group Activities" and "Informal Virtual Activities" point values went back to the original design of giving differing points based on the community type. The two items work in tandem to offer a level playing field for all community types.
  - "Member Engagement: Mentor Board" point value was changed from max. of 5 points to a max. of 3 points.
- Duplicate items have been removed
  - "Leadership: Communication" was removed as it was a duplicate of another item.
  - "Outreach: STC Community Outreach" (newsletter sharing) was changed as it was a duplicate of another item.
- Two new items have been added
  - "Leadership: Conference Presentations" has been added to acknowledge communities that have members that present at regional STC conferences, the STC Summit, or non-STC conferences on tech comm related topics (up to 2 points).
  - "Outreach: STC Community Outreach" now acknowledges communities that share *programs* with two or more communities either virtually or face-to-face (I point).



#### What's New in the 2017 CAA?

**Continued** 

- Required list has been modified to add one requirement
  - (required for SIGS) SIGs must be hosted through STC Hosting, be on WordPress using the common STC platform, and link back to the stc.org site. (NOTE: Chapters must be using STC hosting by July 31, 2017 in order to be considered for awards in 2018.)
- CAA application is easier to submit
  - Applications can be submitted in any format (not just Word) provided the order and wording of the application are not changed.
  - Supporting documents can be submitted as links in the application to Google Docs or any other document sharing site (as long as the evaluation committee has full access).
- Points needed for award levels are now rounded down
- There are 71 base points, with a possible 10 additional bonus points



## **Award Levels**

Award Level	Points Needed (of 71 possible base points*)
Platinum Community Award	63 or more (90%)
Gold Community Award	56 to 62 (80%)
Silver Community Award	49 to 55 (70%)
Bronze Community Award	46 to 48 (65%)

<sup>\*10</sup> possible bonus points
